The **Fountain of Wealth** in Singapore is a unique asset of the country. This is due to the fact that it is the largest fountain in the World. Situated at the heart of the Suntec City this Fountain of Wealth in Singapore has been constructed with such a uniqueness that deserves special mention. The visitors to the Fountain of Wealth Park in the evenings are also allowed to walk past the basement of the fountain to ensure good luck and fortune. The nighttime is perhaps the best possible time to visit the area of the fountain because there is a Laser Show of the fountain at that time. The base of this Fountain of Wealth in Singapore has an area of 1,683 square meters. The shape of the fountain forms a palm of the hand.

The **Omni-Theatre**, a 276-seat theatre is equipped with state-of-the-art IMAX technology which delivers the world's most immersive experience.

Singapore Night Safari: The world's first wildlife park built for visits at night, the Night Safari is not like any ordinary zoo illuminated by the night or a modern version of nocturnal houses found in many zoos around the globe. Through the use of subtle lighting technique, guests are able to view over 1,000 nocturnal animals of 100 species in vast naturalistic habitats.



The **National Library** is a national knowledge institution empowering individuals and businesses with knowledge and information as it continuously expands its vast array of reference collections and services. It preserves and makes accessible Singapore's literary and publishing heritage, and intellectual memory through the Lee Kong Chian Reference Library occupying seven floors (from Level 7 to 13) with a floor area of 60,000 square metres.

The Lee Kong Chian Reference Library, named after Dr Lee Kong Chian, in honour of the Lee Foundation's S\$60 million donation, aims to be the premier resource for works on or about Singapore and the region for local and overseas researchers and academics.

Botanic Garden: The Singapore Botanic Gardens epitomises the tropical island's luxuriant parks. Spread over 52 hectares and close to the centre of the city, the Gardens showcases many outstanding plant collections. Some highlights include the National Orchid Garden, the Ginger Garden, and the Evolution Garden. The numerous plant species here, including many rare specimens, reflect the Singapore Botanic Gardens' richness and diversity of plant life.

Built across the mouth of Marina Channel, the **Marina Barrage** creates Singapore's 15 reservoir, and the first in the heart of the city. With a catchment area of 10,000 hectares, or one-sixth the size of Singapore, the Marina catchment is the island's largest and most urbanized catchment.
